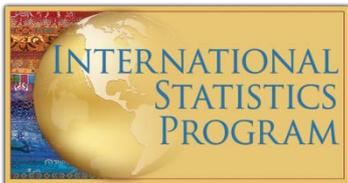
Course Objectives

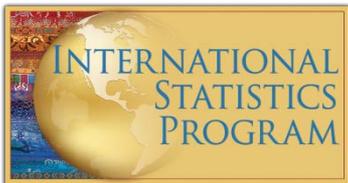

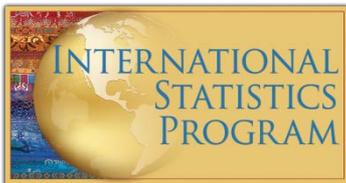
