## Summary Report Final Marriage Statistics, 1970

Marriages performed in the United States during 1970 totaled 2,158,802, an increase of less than 1 percent over 1969. This increase in number was accompanied by an increase in the total population of the United States that caused the marriage rate to remain at 10.6 per 1,000 population, the same as the rate recorded for 1969. This was the first time the rate had stabilized since the period 1959-62, when the rate was 8.5 each year. Through 1969 there had been a steady increase in the marriage rate each year since 1963.


In 1970 the rate per 1,000 unmarried women 15 years and over and the rate per 1,000 unmarried women 15 to 44 years declined 4 and 6 percent, respectively. This was the first decline since 1962 for unmarried women 15 years of age and over and since 1965 for unmarried women 15-44 years of age.

Data on characteristics of marriages are available for the marriage-registration area (MRA) and is believed to be a close approximation of national data. Figures for the MRA show that although the number of marriages for the MRA in 1970 increased by slightly less than 1 percent compared with 1969, there was an increase in the number of remarriages of 5 percent for men and 4 percent for women, and a decline in first marriages of less than 1 percent for

both men and women. First marriage rates in 1970 declined from 1969 rates for both men and women. For women, this followed a decline from 1968 to 1969 that broke an upward trend from 1963 to 1968. The decline in 1970 occurred in every age group except two that account for only a small proportion of all first marriages—14 to 17 years and 65 years and over. First marriage rates declined for men also in 1970 but the rates for four age groups increased—14-17, 20-24, 45-64, and 65 years and over.

In spite of the increase in the number of remarriages, remarriage rates declined in 1970 for the first time since 1967 for men and since 1965 for women. The remarriage rates for both sexes declined

in 1970 for all age groups except for those 65 years and over. The remarriage rate for women aged 14-24 was lower for 1970 than for any other year during the 1963-69 period and 27 percent lower than for 1969. The remarriage rate for women aged 25-44 was the lowest since 1964. For men, the decline from 1969 in the remarriage rate was 33 percent at ages 14-24 years and 10 percent for those 25-44 years of age.

The median age of brides at first marriage was 20.6 years. This was unchanged from 1968 and 1969, but higher than the median age for the years 1963-67. In contrast to the trend in first marriages, median age at remarriage for brides has declined from 35.6 in 1963 to 33.3 in 1970.

The trend in median age for men marrying for the first time was not as consistent as the trend for men who were remarrying. The median age at first marriage for grooms was slightly higher in 1970 than in 1968 or 1969 but the same as in 1963. The median age at remarriage for men has declined each year, from 39.8 in 1963 to 37.5 in 1970.

#### Place and Time of Occurrence

Marriages are those performed during the year. Marriages and marriage rates for States and other areas are by place of occurrence. In table 2, however, figures for marriages shown for some States are by place and date the marriage license was issued.

#### Sources of Data

Figures in tables 1 and 2 are based on totals reported by States and counties. All other figures in the tables are based on data tabulated from probability samples of records selected in the National Center for Health Statistics from copies of the records sent in by States participating in the marriage-registration area. For the 3 years 1968-70, 39 States and the District of Columbia participated.

### Marriage Sample

Records were sampled at different rates designed to give a sample of at least 2,500 records for each State except four, where less than 5,000 marriages were performed. For these States all records were included in the sample. One-half of all records were included from seven States and the District of Columbia, one-fifth from nine States, one-tenth from 12 States, and one-twentieth from seven States. Sampling errors shown in the table above are for frequencies which equal a specified percent of 1970 totals for each State and the MRA.
