# Registered Births


In 1973 there were 3.136.965 registered live births in the United States, a decline of 3.7 percent from 3.258.411 in 1972. Provisional data through November indicate no further decline in 1974.

#### Fertility Rate

In 1973 the fertility rate was 69.2 births per 1,000 women 15-44 years of age, the lowest ever observed in the United States. It was nearly 6 percent lower than the rate of 73.4 in 1972 and almost 44 percent lower than the rate of 122.7, adjusted for underregistration, observed in 1957. The fertility rate declined between 1957 and 1968, increased slightly until 1970, and then continued to decline through 1973.

#### Birth Rate

The birth rate was 14.9 births per 1,000 population in 1973, nearly 5 percent lower than the rate of 15.6 in 1972. It was the second consecutive year in which both the birth and fertility rates were below the low rates of the 1930's. Although the fertility rate remained above the level of the 1930's until 1972, the birth rate has been at or below the low rates of the 1930's since 1966. This is because the childbearing population (assumed to consist of women 15-44 years of age) is now a smaller proportion of the total population than in the prewar years. In 1936, the middle of the 1933-39 period, the childbearing population constituted 24 percent of the total population; in 1973 it was 22 percent. As a result of the decline in this proportion, the fertility of these women cannot maintain the birth rate of the total population at the same level relative to the fertility rate as in the 1930's.



#### Age of Mother

The number of births and birth rates decreased between 1972 and 1973 for all women except those under 15 years of age, who account for a very small proportion of total births. The number of births for women under 15 years increased 6 percent. The smallest decrease, 1 percent, occurred for women aged 25-29 and 30-34 years, while other decreases ranged from 2 percent for women aged 15-19 years to 15 percent for women 45-49 years.

During 1973 the birth rate for women under 15 years of age increased 8 percent. Declines in birth rates ranged from nearly 4 percent for women 15-19 years to 25 percent for women 45-49 years of age.

#### Live-Birth Order

During 1973 birth rates for all birth orders declined. The magnitude of the decline generally increased with each subsequent birth order after second order births. The rate for first order births decreased 4 percent; for second order births, 2 percent; and for higher order births decreases ranged from 8 to 25 percent.

#### Age of Mother and Live-Birth Order

The declines in the birth rates by age of mother and by live-birth order were all more than 10 percent between 1970 and 1973. This masks some smaller declines and some increases in the rates for certain birth orders within age groups. For all ages combined the declines in the rates for third and higher order births were nearly twice the declines for first and second order births (at least 28 percent compared with less than 16 percent). In some age groups differences in rates of decline were even wider. For example, for the age group 25-29 years the rates for third and higher order births declined more than 30 percent between 1970 and 1973, while the rates for first and second orders declined less than 8 percent, due in part to a slight increase from 1972 to 1973; For the age group 30-34 years the rate for first order births was the same in 1970 and 1973, while the rate for second order births increased slightly; rates for third and higher orders declined by more than 20 percent.

# Color and Race

In 1973 the fertility rate was 65.3 births per 1,000 women for white women and 94.3 for both all other and Negro women. The differential between rates for white and Negro women narrowed from 1965 to 1970.

The race differential widened during 1971 and 1972 because the fertility rate for white women decreased at a faster rate than for Negro women. During 1973, however, the race differential again decreased because of the larger decline in the fertility rate for Negro women than for white women.

#### Geographic Division and State

Numbers of births and birth rates for geographic divisions and States are shown in table 8. Numbers of births declined for all divisions except the Mountain Division and for all States except Idaho, Wyoming, Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona, and Utah, all of which are included in the Mountain Division. Birth rates declined for all divisions and all States except Idaho and Utah.

#### Sex Ratio of Births

The sex ratio of births occurring in 1973 was 1,052 males per 1,000 females. This ratio varies little from year to year and is consistently higher for white than for Negro births. In 1973 this ratio was 1,057 for white births and 1,028 for Negro births.

#### Month of Birth

Table 7 shows the final numbers of births in 1973 by month of birth and race and the observed and seasonally adjusted birth and fertility rates.

#### Attendant at Birth


In 1973, 99.3 percent of all live births were classified as having been delivered by physicians in hospitals. Physicians outside hospitals delivered 0.2 percent, and midwives and other and unspecified persons delivered the remaining 0.5 percent.

# Age of Father

In 1973 the birth rate for men was 56.1 births per 1,000 men aged 15-54 years, a decline of 6 percent from the rate of 59.4 in 1972. The birth rate for white men decreased 6 percent from 54.9 in 1972 to 51.8 in 1973. The birth rate for Negro men also decreased 6 percent from 93.0 in 1972 to 87.3 in 1973. For white men the highest rate (127.2) was observed for men aged 25-29 years, while for Negro men the highest rate (189.5) was observed for men 20-24 years.

Birth rates for men declined for all age groups except 55 years and over, where it remained the same. The largest decline, 12 percent, occurred among men aged 50-54 years. Declines for other age groups ranged from 3 to 10 percent.

#### Weight at Birth

Low-birth-weight infants are those who weigh 2,500 grams (5 pounds 8 ounces) or less at birth. During 1973, 7.6 percent of all live births were in this category compared with 7.7 percent in 1972. The proportion of Negro infants of low birth weight (13.3 percent) was more than twice as high as the proportion of white infants (6.4 percent).

The median birth weight for all infants was 3,310 grams, or about 7 pounds 5 ounces, the same

as in 1972. White infants had a higher median weight (3,350 grams) than Negro infants (3,140 grams), a difference of approximately 7 ounces.

#### Multiple Births

There were 57,721 live births in multiple deliveries in 1973. The multiple birth ratio was 18.4 live births in multiple deliveries per 1,000 total live births. The ratio for white births was 17.7, and for Negro births it was 22.2.

#### **Illegitimate Births**

National estimates of the number of illegitimate births are based on information reported on the birth certificates of 38 States and the District of Columbia.

In 1973 there were an estimated 407,300 illegitimate births, an increase of 1 percent over 1972. Of these illegitimate births, 163,000 were white, an increase of nearly 2 percent since 1972. This followed a decrease in the number of white illegitimate births for 2 consecutive years. Negro illegitimate births increased less than 1 percent, to 234,500 in 1973.

The number of illegitimate births to women under 15 years of age increased 10 percent in 1973. This was due largely to the almost 19-percent increase for white women in this age group. The number of illegitimate births increased 1 percent for women aged 15-19 years and 5 percent for women aged 25-29 years. Decreases occurred for all other age groups and ranged from less than 1 percent to 5 percent.

The illegitimacy rate, which is a measure of the "risk" of having an illegitimate birth, declined for the third consecutive year, following a period of almost uninterrupted increase from 1962 to 1970. It decreased 2 percent, from 24.9 illegitimate births per 1,000 unmarried women in 1972 to 24.5 in 1973. Decreases observed in rates for white and Negro women were 1 and 3 percent, respectively. The rate decreased for all age groups except 15-19 years, where it remained the same as in 1972. The rate increased slightly for white women 15-19 years and 40 years and over and for Negro women 30-34 years but decreased for all other age-race groups.

The illegitimacy ratio increased 5 percent, to 129.8 illegitimate births per 1,000 live births. This increase is largely attributable to the declining numbers of legitimate births.

#### Interval Since Last Live Birth

The date of last live birth, reported by 40 States and the District of Columbia in 1973, is used to compute the interval since last live birth for second and higher order births.

The mean interval since last live birth increased from 42.6 months in 1972 to 43.3 months in 1973. For white births it increased from 43.0 to 43.6 months, while for Negro births it increased from 41.0 to 42.4 months.

The mean interval since last live birth increased with increasing birth order from 39.2 months for second order births to 51.2 months for fifth order births and then decreased to 42.6 months for births of eighth and higher order.

Of all second and higher order births, 27.1 percent were born within 24 months of the last live birth, a

decline from 29.6 percent in 1972. In 1973 the comparable proportions were 25.6 for white births and 34.2 for Negro births. In 1972 they were 28.1 and 37.2 percent, respectively.

The percent of live births occurring less than 24 months since the last live birth decreased from 27.1 for second order births to 26.6 for third order births and then increased to 33.7 for eighth and higher order births.

#### Educational Attainment of Mother and Father

During 1973, 41 States and the District of Columbia reported educational attainment of parents on the birth certificate. In these reporting areas 69.4 percent of all mothers and 75.9 percent of all fathers of live births occurring in that year had completed at least 12 years of formal education in public schools or the equivalent in accredited private or parochial schools. The proportion of parents having no more than 8 years of schooling decreased to 6.7 percent of mothers and 7.4 percent of fathers, continuing a steady decline since 1969, the first year educational attainment data were available.

Although the race differential continued to decrease, the educational attainment of white mothers was still higher than that of Negro mothers. Of those white mothers giving birth in 1973, 73.3 percent had completed 12 years or more of formal schooling compared with 51.5 percent of Negro mothers. The race differential for fathers has not been as great as for mothers and has been narrowing also. The proportion of white fathers having completed 12 years or more of schooling was 77.5 percent and of Negro fathers it was 64.1 percent.

The median number of years of school completed by white mothers of infants born in 1973 was 12.5, while for Negro mothers it was 12.0. For white fathers the median was 12.7 years and for Negro fathers, 12.3 years.

By age of mother, the median years of school completed among mothers 15 years of age and over rose from 11.2 for mothers 15-19 years to 12.7 for mothers 25-29 years and then declined to 12.2 for mothers 40 years and over. A similar pattern was observed for white mothers, with a low of 11.3 for mothers 15-19 years, a peak of 12.8 at ages 25-29 years, and a decrease to 12.3 at ages 40 years and over. For Negro mothers the median rose from 11.1 for mothers 15-19 years to 12.4 for mothers 25-29 years and then decreased to a low of 10.8 for mothers 40 years and over.

By live-birth order, the median years of school completed by all mothers decreased from 12.5 for first and second order births to 10.7 for eighth or higher order births. Similar patterns were observed for white and Negro mothers.

# Month of Pregnancy Prenatal Care Began

In 1973, 42 States and the District of Columbia reported month of pregnancy prenatal care began. The proportion of mothers beginning care during the first trimester of pregnancy increased from 69.4 percent in 1972 to 70.8 percent in 1973. The proportion with no prenatal care decreased from 1.6 percent in 1972 to 1.5 percent in 1973.

There was a large difference between white and Negro mothers in the distributions by time of first prenatal visit. While 74.9 percent of white mothers began care during the first trimester, only 51.5 percent of Negro mothers began care during this trimester. Only 1.1 percent of white mothers had no care in contrast to 3.4 percent of Negro mothers.

Among infants born to mothers having no prenatal care, 21.1 percent were in the low-birth-weight category (2,500 grams or less), while among those born to mothers with some care, only 7.2 percent were in this category. The proportions of low-birth-weight infants born to white and Negro mothers having no care were 17.5 percent and 27.4 percent, respectively, and to those having some care, 6.2 percent and 12.6 percent, respectively.

#### Number of Prenatal Visits

In 1973, 38 States and the District of Columbia reported the number of prenatal visits on the birth certificate. The median number of prenatal visits was 10.6 for all mothers receiving prenatal care, 10.9 for white mothers, and 8.6 for Negro mothers.

The number of prenatal visits is correlated with the trimester of pregnancy in which prenatal care began in the 37 States and the District of Columbia in which both items were reported. The median number of prenatal visits for mothers beginning care in the first trimester was 11.7; in the second trimester, 8.3; and in the third trimester, 4.6. Comparable medians for white mothers were 11.9, 8.7, and 4.9 visits and for Negro mothers, 10.2, 7.2, and 4.2 visits, indicating that a portion of the race differential observed for median number of visits can be attributed to the trimester in which prenatal care began.

There was a slight increase in the median number of prenatal visits for both racial groups and for each trimester of first visit between 1972 and 1973.

#### Period of Gestation 4

A premature infant is one born before 37 weeks of gestation. In 1973, 40 States and the District of Columbia measured length of gestation from the first day of the mother's last normal menstrual period (LMP). In LMP reporting areas during 1973 there was a decline of 4 percent in the proportion of live births considered premature (9.6 percent in 1972 and 9.2 percent in 1973). More than twice as high a proportion of Negro infants (16.7 percent) as white infants (7.7 percent) born in LMP reporting areas were premature.

Of all births occurring in LMP reporting areas in 1973, 35.5 percent were born at 37-39 weeks gestation, 22.4 percent were born at 40 weeks gestation, and 24.5 percent were born at 41-42 weeks gestation.

# **SOURCES OF DATA**

Data shown in this report for 1973 are based on copies of all birth certificates in Colorado, Florida, Maine, Michigan, Missouri, New Hampshire, New York

(exclusive of New York City), Rhode Island, and Vermont and on 50 percent of the birth certificates received from all other areas.

This report presents summary tabulations from the final natality statistics for 1973. More detailed tabulations for 1973 will be published in *Vital Statistics of the United States*, 1973, *Volume I—Natality*. Prior to the publication of that volume, the National Center for Health Statistics will respond to requests for unpublished data whenever possible.
