Births and Birth Rates

There were 3,326,632 live births registered in the United States in 1977. This was about 5 percent more than the number registered in 1976. Provisional data for the first 9 months of 1978 indicate that the number of births is just slightly below the level recorded for the same period in 1977.

The birth and the fertility rates both increased for the first time since 1970. These rates reached record low levels in 1972-76. The birth rate was 15.4 births per 1,000 population for 1977, or 4 percent higher than the rate for 1976. The fertility rate of 67.8 births per 1,000

women 15-44 years of age was 3 percent above the rate for 1976.

The increase in fertility is reflected in higher birth rates for women aged 18-39 years. Rates for the age groups 15-17 and 40-44 years declined slightly and were unchanged for the age groups under 15 and 45-49 years. The increases between 1976 and 1977 were most rapid for women aged 25-29 years (5.0 percent) and 30-34 years (5.5 percent).

The total fertility rate, which shows implications of current levels of fertility for completed family size, was 1,826.3 in 1977. This was 3 percent higher than the rate in 1976 (1,768.2).

Figure 1. LIVE BIRTHS AND FERTILITY RATES: UNITED STATES, 1910-77





Figure 2. BIRTH RATES BY AGE OF MOTHER: UNITED STATES, 1950-77

(Beginning 1959 trend lines are based on registered live births; trend lines for 1950-59 are based on live births adjusted for underregistration)




Birth rates increased 2.5 to 5.2 percent for first through fourth order births, with third order births having the largest increase. Rates for higher order births generally continued to decline—fifth order birth rates decreased 5.9 percent and eighth and higher order birth rates decreased 16.7 percent. Levels for sixth and seventh order births remained unchanged from the previous year.

Within the two age groups where fertility increases were greatest (25-29 and 30-34 years), the largest increases were in the rates for first order births. This is an indication that part of the increase in fertility among women of these ages reflects previously postponed births. The rates for first order births to women of these ages (25-29 and 30-34 years) increased 8.3 and 11.2 percent, respectively.

The fertility rates for white and black women both increased about the same amount between 1976 and 1977 (nearly 3 percent). In 1977 the fertility rate for white women was 64.0 and for black women, 89.8. The differential between these two groups in the rate of childbearing remained at about the same level as in 1976.

There was an increase in the number of births between 1976 and 1977 in all geographic divisions and States. Increases in the numbers of births ranged from 2.8 percent (Middle Atlantic Division) to 6.5 percent (East South Central Division). Birth rates increased in all geographic divisions and in all States except Alaska, where there was a slight decline. Increases in the rates for geographic divisions ranged from 2.9 percent (West South Central) to 5.4 percent (West North Central).

Sex Ratio of Births

In 1977 there were 1,053 male births for every 1,000 female births. The sex ratio of births varies little from year to year and is consistently higher for white births than for black births. This ratio was 1,058 for white births and 1,026 for black births in 1977.

Month of Birth

There is a consistent seasonal pattern in the occurrence of births during the year, with the peak in August or September. Removal of the seasonal component from monthly birth and fertility rates facilitates the observation of underlying trends. The seasonally adjusted rates show that the first quarter of 1977 was the only period in which there was a sustained increase. There was no consistent pattern of change for the remainder of the year.

Attendant at Birth

Of the 3,326,632 live births in 1977, 98.5 percent were classified as having been delivered by physicians in hospitals. The remaining 1.5 percent of births delivered outside of hospitals were delivered almost equally by physicians, midwives, other, and unspecified persons.

Age of Father

In 1977 the birth rate for men increased to 55.7 births per 1,000 men aged 15-54 years. This rate was 3.5 percent higher than the rate in 1976.

Teenage males were the only group for which there was a decline in the rate (1.0 percent) between 1976 and 1977. Birth rates for men in other age groups increased 1.1 to 4.8 percent or remained unchanged.

The birth rates for white and black men both increased about the same amount between 1976 and 1977 (slightly over 3 percent). The rate for white men rose from 49.9 to 51.6, and the rate for black men rose from 81.4 to 84.1.

Weight at Birth

Infants born in 1977 had a median birth weight of 3,340 grams (approximately 7 pounds 6 ounces). The median weights for white and black babies were 3,390 and 3,150 grams, respectively, a difference of about 8 ounces.

The proportion of infants that were of low birth weight (2,500 grams or less) decreased 2.7 percent between 1976 and 1977—7.1 percent compared with 7.3 percent. The decrease in the percent of low birth weight among white babies amounted to 3.3 percent compared with a 1.5-percent decrease among black babies. Black babies were more than twice as likely as white babies to be of low birth weight. The percent of black infants weighing 2,500 grams or less was 12.8 compared with 5.9 percent of white infants.

Proportions of infants of low birth weight varied considerably according to maternal age. In general, teenage mothers and mothers 40 years of age and over had the greatest risks of having a baby of low birth weight. The percents of babies of low birth weight to mothers in these age groups were up to 2.6 times as great as the percent to mothers aged 25-29 years, who had the lowest risk (5.8 percent).

Multiple Births

During 1977 there were 63,956 live births in multiple deliveries (twins, triplets, etc.). The majority of these, 62,880, were live births in

twin deliveries. The multiple birth ratio was 19.2 live births in multiple deliveries per 1,000 total live births. This ratio is consistently higher for black births than for white births. In 1977 these ratios were 18.5 for white births and 23.3 for black births.

Births to Unmarried Women

National estimates of births to unmarried women are based on information reported on the birth certificates of 37 States and the District of Columbia.

The number of births to unmarried women continued to rise in 1977 to 515,700, an increase of 10.1 percent over the number in 1976. This increase in the number of births to unmarried women is a result of the rising number of single women in the population as well as an increase in the rate of childbearing among these women.

The rate of childbearing among unmarried women increased 5.3 percent, from 24.7 out-of-wedlock births per 1,000 unmarried women in 1976 to 26.0 in 1977.

Between 1976 and 1977 the number of births to unmarried women increased for all age groups except girls under 15 years of age, for whom there was a decline of 1.9 percent and women 40 years of age and over, for whom there was no change. Increases in the number were largest for women aged 20-24 years (16 percent). Birth rates for unmarried women increased for those aged 15-29 years. These increases accelerated as age increased from 15-17 years (4.1 percent) to 20-24 years (7.8 percent) and then dropped for women aged 25-29 years (3.6 percent). Rates declined from 3.4 to 6.7 percent for women in the groups aged 30 years and over.

In 1977 of every 1,000 live births, 155.0 were to unmarried women compared with a ratio of 147.8 per 1,000 in 1976.

Between 1976 and 1977 the number of births to unmarried white women increased 11.7 percent, and the number of births to unmarried black women increased 8.8 percent. Increases in the birth rate for unmarried women 15-44 years of age amounted to 7.9 percent for white women and 1.6 percent for black women. There were increases in the rate of childbearing among

unmarried white women in all age groups under 30 years. Rates declined for white women aged 30-39 years and remained the same for those 40 years of age and over. Birth rates for unmarried black women increased for the ages 18-34 years and declined for those 15-17 and 35 years of age and over.

Interval Since Last Live Birth

The date of the mother's last live birth was reported on the birth certificates of 43 States and the District of Columbia in 1977. The interval since the last live birth for all second and higher order births is computed from this item.

Approximately half (49.4 percent) of second and higher order births to residents of the reporting area occurred within 3 years of the birth of a previous child.

The mean interval since the last live birth was 45.5 months in 1977, a slight increase over the mean interval for 1976—45.1 months. The mean interval for white births increased from 45.1 to 45.2 months, and the increase for black births was from 46.2 months to 47.3 months.

As birth order increased, the proportion of births occurring less than 2 years after the birth of a previous child increased. Among second order births, 25.0 percent occurred less than 2 years after the birth of a previous child compared with 36.5 percent of births of eighth and higher order.

Educational Attainment of Mother and Father

Educational attainment of parents was reported on birth certificates in 44 States and the District of Columbia in 1977.

Nearly three-fourths of all births to residents of these areas were to mothers who had completed 12 years or more of formal education in public schools or the equivalent in accredited private or parochial schools. The proportion of babies to fathers with this amount of education was greater—over 80 percent.

The median years of school completed by parents was 12.5 for mothers and 12.7 for fathers.

The educational attainment level of parents has increased each year since 1969 when these statistics first became available. The proportion

of births to mothers who were college graduates increased from 8.5 percent in 1969 to 12.6 percent in 1977. The comparable increase over this period for fathers was from 16.4 to 21.0 percent.

Although the educational attainment levels of black parents have increased substantially over the years, large racial differences still exist. In 1977, 77.1 percent of white births compared with 59.0 percent of black births were to mothers with 12 years or more of school. The education differential between fathers, though not as great as between mothers, is substantial—81.5 percent of white births compared with 71.7 percent of black births were to fathers who completed 12 years or more of school.

The median years of school completed by parents according to race were 12.6 for white mothers, 12.8 for white fathers, 12.2 for black mothers, and 12.5 for black fathers.

The median years of school completed varied widely according to maternal age. Mothers 25-39 years of age had the highest levels of educational attainment (12.9 years) and the lowest levels were, of course, among girls under 15 years of age (6.3 years).

Levels of educational attainment were highest for mothers having their first or second child (12.6 years). The median years of school completed slowly decreased as family size increased. Mothers having their eighth child or more completed a median of 10.9 years.

Month of Pregnancy Prenatal Care Began

The proportion of births to mothers who began prenatal care during the early months of their pregnancy continued to rise in 1977. This information was collected from the birth certificates of 44 States and the District of Columbia in 1977. The proportion of births to mothers who began care during the first 3 months of their pregnancy increased from 73.5 to 74.1 percent between 1976 and 1977. The proportion of births to mothers who received no prenatal care was the same as in 1976—1.4 percent.

White mothers are more likely to receive prenatal care during the early months of pregnancy than are black mothers. The proportions receiving no prenatal care are more likely to be higher among black mothers. Although there

have been substantial gains in the proportions of black mothers receiving care early and concomitant decreases in the proportion receiving no care, large differences between the two racial groups still exist. In 1977, 77.3 percent of white births were to mothers who began care during the first 3 months of their pregnancy compared with 59.0 percent of black births. The proportions receiving no care were 1.1 percent for white births and 2.8 percent for black births.

Proportions of births to mothers having early prenatal care and no prenatal care varied widely according to maternal age. Women aged 25-29 years and 30-34 years were most likely to begin care during the first 3 months of their pregnancy (82.6 and 81.6 percent, respectively). Levels of no care were lowest among these age groups—0.8 percent (25-29 years) and 1.0 percent (30-34 years). Girls under 15 years of age were least likely to have early prenatal care—only 32.1 percent had care during the first 3 months of pregnancy, and 5.8 percent had no prenatal care at all.

Number of Prenatal Visits

Information on the number of visits made for prenatal care was available from the birth certificates of 41 States and the District of Columbia during 1977.

Mothers who received some prenatal care had a median of 10.9 visits. The median number for white mothers was 11.2 compared with 9.4 for black mothers.

The median number of visits made is greatly influenced by the month of pregnancy in which prenatal care began. Information on the month of pregnancy prenatal care began and the number of prenatal visits was available from 40 States and the District of Columbia in 1977. The median number of visits made for prenatal care declines as initiation of care is delayed until later in pregnancy. The median number of visits made by mothers who started care in the first 2 months of pregnancy was 11.9. This number declined with increasing postponement of care to 4.8 for women who began care in the last trimester of pregnancy.

When the median number of visits for white and black mothers who began care at the same time during their pregnancies is compared, the

differences are not as great as the difference in the total median number of visits. Therefore, much of the racial difference in the total median number of visits is a result of the fact that white mothers began care earlier than black mothers.

Period of Gestation

Length of gestation is measured from the first day of the mother's last normal menstrual period (LMP), an item which was reported by 42 States and the District of Columbia in 1977.

The great majority of births (82.6 percent)

occurred at 37-42 weeks of gestation. The proportion of births that were premature (before 37 weeks of gestation) was 8.8 percent in 1977, unchanged from the percent in 1976.

Black babies were twice as likely as white babies to be born prematurely. The proportions born prematurely according to race were 16.1 percent for black births and 7.4 percent for white births.

Birth weight is strongly related to length of gestation. Of those births that were premature, 41.1 percent were of low birth weight compared with 3.2 percent of full-term births.

SOURCES OF DATA

Data shown in this report for 1977 are based on 100 percent of the birth certificates from Alabama, Alaska, Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New York, North Carolina, Ohio,

Oklahoma, Oregon, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia, and Wisconsin; these States provided data through the Cooperative Health Statistics System. Data from the remaining areas are based on a 50-percent sample of birth certificates filed in those areas.
