Section A	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Respondent demographic characteristics (age; DOB; opposite-sex marital/cohabitation status; race and Hispanic origin; primary language) • Household roster (age; sex; relationship of each member to respondent) • Education (degrees; date of high school and college graduation; highest grade completed; date last attended) • Basic information about his childhood family background and parents • His experience as a minor with living in a foster home • Numbers of marriages and cohabitations
Section B	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ever had sexual intercourse • Sex education received (respondents younger than 25 only) • Sterilizing operations and fertility problems • Number of sexual partners in lifetime and last 12 months • Enumeration of (up to) three most recent female sexual partners, or last partner ever
Section C	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Marital and cohabitation dates for current wife/partner • Surgical sterilization and infertility for wife/partner • Biological children with current wife/partner • Other children his current wife/partner had from previous relationships (more details if he ever lived with the child) • Other non-biological children he and current wife/partner ever cared for • First and last sex: dates and contraceptive use • Contraceptive use in last 12 months
Section D	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Information on (up to) three sexual partners in the past 12 months or last partner ever, (enumerated in Section B), including demographic data, dates and contraceptive use at first and most recent sex, and contraceptive use in last 12 months • Information on children with these partners (as enumerated in Section C)
Section E	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Information on former wives and first cohabiting partner • Information on children with these partners (as enumerated in Section C)
Section F	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Information on other biological children fathered (as enumerated in Section C) • Information on other non-biological children ever raised (more details if adopted, as enumerated in Sections C through E) • Pregnancies fathered in his lifetime that did not result in live birth (total number and numbers by outcome) • Exact number of female partners—lifetime and in last 12 months (if or more reported in B)
Section G	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activities with one focal child living in his household • Activities with one focal child (biological or adopted) living elsewhere • Financial support of his biological and adopted children living elsewhere

Section H	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Desire for (wanting) a/another baby (respondent and wife/cohabiting partner) • Intentions to have a/another baby, asked individually or jointly, as appropriate • When expect next child to be born, asked individually or jointly, as appropriate
Section I	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Usual source of health care • Health insurance coverage in last 12 months • Disability • Experience with cancer • Health services received in last 12 months • Infertility services and diagnoses received • HIV testing experience
Section J	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Residence as of April 1, 2010 • Place of birth (date came to U.S., if born outside of the U.S.) • Religion and attendance of religious services, at age 14 and currently • Military service Work in past 12 months and current work status (respondent and current wife/cohabiting partner) • Expectations to marry or cohabit, if not married or cohabiting • Attitudes: including relationships, sex, condom use, gender roles, and parenthood
Section K (ACASI)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • General health questions • Significant life events including homelessness and prison experience • School suspension/expulsion (for respondents 15-24 years old) • Pregnancies fathered • Substance use (alcohol; marijuana; cocaine; crack; crystal meth; illicit injection drugs) • Sexual experience with females (vaginal intercourse, oral sex, and anal sex; condom use at last occurrence of each type of sex; timing of oral sex relative to vaginal intercourse (for respondents 15-24 who have had both types of sex) • Non-voluntary intercourse with females (asked only for respondents 18 or older) • Number of female partners in lifetime; numbers of female partners in last 12 months (including numbers by specific type of sex); and other STD/HIV risk behaviors) • Sexual intercourse with males (specific sexual behaviors he may have engaged in; condom use at last occurrence of anal or oral sex) • Non-voluntary sex with males (asked only for respondents 18 or older); STD/HIV risk behaviors, including number of male partners • Sexual orientation and attraction • Whether doctor had asked specific questions in last 12 months about sexual risk-related behaviors • STD experience (some items limited to last 12 months) • Individual earnings, family income, sources of income, types of public assistance, and economic insecurity during the previous year
