### FAMILY OUT-OF-POCKET HEALTH EXPENSES

#### INTRODUCTION

During January-March 1976 a survey was conducted to measure out-of-pocket health expenses of the civilian noninstitutionalized population of the United States by the Division of Health Interview Statistics. National Center for Health Statistics. For this first quarter of 1976 a mail-in questionnaire was left with each family or unrelated individual interviewed. This questionnaire was to be used to obtain information about direct out-of-pocket spending during 1975 for each person in the family unit—each family member or each unrelated individual. Information was requested on spending for hospital, dental, or optical services; prescribed medicine; and other medical expenses for each family member as well as the total amount of health insurance premiums (including Social Security Medicare premiums) paid directly by the family unit or deducted from paychecks during 1975. Also requested were the health expenditures for persons not residing in the household (see appendix III). These would include health expenses of students away at school, or for parents or other persons not living with the family unit for whom some share of medical costs is assumed.

Results of the survey of health expenses has been published on a person basis (with the exception of spending for persons outside the family unit) in Personal Out-of-Pocket Health Expenses, United States, 1975, Vital and Health Statistics, Series 10, No. 122.

In this report information on out-of-pocket health expenses is presented for families and unrelated individuals. A family is defined as two or more persons related by blood, marriage, or adoption who are living together in the same household. A member of the Armed Forces living at home who is the husband of a husbandwife family is counted in classifying the family by size and type. In earlier reports of family statistics these members of the Armed Forces living at home were not counted in the classification of the family type. Unrelated individuals may be living alone, with other unrelated individuals, or with families to which they are not related.

The average out-of-pocket spending for hospital, doctor, dental, and optical services; prescription medicine; and other medical expenses for a family of two or more members was \$575 in 1975 (tables A and B). When health insurance premiums are added the total becomes \$773, and when expense for persons outside the family are also added, the grand total was \$798. These same totals for unrelated individuals are, respectively, \$232, \$323, and \$351 (tables C and D).

The annual per family estimate for a health expense item was obtained by summing the reported spending for which all members of the family responded with a known amount (zero or a dollar amount). For instance, in a 4-member husband-wife family with two children, each of the four members must have a known amount recorded for the expense item before a family total is prepared; if only three members had known amounts and the expense for the fourth member was omitted or unknown, no family total was calculated. The average annual expense per family was then obtained by summing the

known expense over all families with known amounts and dividing by the number of such families.

This procedure was used to obtain the average expense per family unit for each of the

three totals shown in tables A and C. Thus, for instance, the grand total for a 3-member family consists of known amounts for all 8 items of expense for each of the three members of the family, a total of 24 items of information with

zero or dollar amounts. Table E shows that this condition was met for 75.5 percent of all families and for 81.8 percent of all unrelated individuals (one-person units) for the grand total of out-of-pocket health expenses.

Although it was necessary to exclude the data for a family for which only one or a few

items were missing in producing the total expenses for the family, this does not apply necessarily to individual types of expense. For example, suppose the missing item was dental visit expense of one member of a family. There is known data for each member for 7 of the 8 individual items of expense. Therefore, even though

the three sets of totals do not include this family, the family data are used for 7 of the individual expense items. As shown in table F, reporting of known amounts by all members of families ranged from 84.6-87.1 percent and from 87.4-91.7 percent for unrelated individuals. This procedure for obtaining totals by using known data for all items is the same as that used for the report Personal Out-of-Pocket Health Expenses.

However, using separate procedures to calculate the two types of totals, total family expenses for groups of items and family expense for individual items, means that the sum of individual expense items may or may not equal the total for all expense items in tables A, C, and elsewhere. Some portion of the discrepancy results from the rounding of computed dollar averages per expense item to the nearest dollar. The remainder of the discrepancy, as discussed in the previous paragraph, results from the use of unequal numbers of records with known

dollar or zero amounts for family totals and for the individual expense items.

# SOURCE AND LIMITATIONS OF THE DATA

The information on health spending in 1975 presented in this report was obtained from responses to a questionnaire left with the respondents to the health interviews conducted for the Health Interview Survey during January-March 1976. Information in the regular Health Interview Survey is based on data collected in a continuing nationwide survey conducted by household interview. Each week a probability sample of households is interviewed by trained personnel of the U.S. Bureau of the Census to obtain information about the health and other characteristics of each person living in the household who is in the civilian noninstitutionalized population of the United States. During the 13 weeks of the January-March 1976

quarter there were 10,394 households with people living in them. Of these households 10,001 containing 28,006 persons were interviewed. These 28,006 persons were members of some 10,423 family units (families or unrelated individuals). The total noninterview rate was about 3.8 percent—2.2 percent was refusal, and the remainder was primarily due to the failure to find an eligible respondent at home after repeated calls.

A description of the design of the Health Interview Survey, the methods used in estimation, and general qualifications of the data obtained from this survey are presented in appendix I. Since the estimates shown in this report are based on a sample of the population, they are subject to sampling error. Therefore particular attention should be paid to the section entitled "Reliability of Estimates." Sampling errors for many of the estimates are of relatively low magnitude. However, where an estimated number or the numerator or denominator of a rate or percentage is small, the sampling error may be high. Charts of relative sampling errors and instructions for their use are shown in appendix I.

Certain terms used in this report are defined in appendix II. The questionnaire used to obtain out-of-pocket health spending is illustrated in appendix III. The basic questionnaire used in the health interview is presented in the Current Estimates report for 1976 (Series 10, No. 119).

Following completion of the household interview, the interviewer entered the identification items on a copy of the Family Medical Expenses questionnaire and also entered the names of related family members on separate pages of the questionnaire. The questionnaire and a self-addressed envelope was handed to the respondent with the request that it be completed and returned to the U.S. Burcau of the Census regional office within 5 days. If there were more than one family unit (a family or unrelated individual) in the household, additional questionnaires were prepared. If the questionnaire was not mailed to the regional office, another copy of the questionnaire was prepared and mailed to the family unit. If this questionnaire was not returned, a telephone followup was conducted to obtain the information.

The response to the initial or followup

questionnaire and telephone followup was such that 90.1 percent of the 10,423 family units submitted questionnaire information with usable data for at least one or more of the seven expense items.

#### Families and Unrelated Individuals

The civilian noninstitutionalized population during January-March 1976 was 210,109,000. There were an estimated 21,110,000 unrelated individuals and the remainder were members of 57,336,000 families. Health Interview Survey figures differ from those for March 1976 published by the U.S. Bureau of the Census (see table G).

The content of the 48,688,000 husband-wife families differs from that in prior family data published in Series 10 reports. Heretofore, no attempt was made to reflect the family composition when an Armed Forces member was living at home. If such a person was a husband, he was treated in the statistics as an absent person and the wife was counted as the head of an "other family group" if she had a child or other relative living with her, or as an unrelated individual if she was not living with a relative. Beginning with this report an Armed Forces member living at home with his wife is counted as a husband-wife

family with size of family of two or more depending on additional relatives in the family. The age of the head is that of the wife since there is no record of the age of the husband in the questionnaire. It is assumed that in the age groupings of the head in the detailed tables there is not much error caused by using the wife's age.

The change in procedure for treating a husband in the Armed Forces living at home should have the effect of making the count of husband-wife families more similar to the Census figures, and should also reduce the difference in counts of other family groups and unrelated individuals resulting from omission of these Armed Forces members. However, another source of difference involves the classification of college students living away from home during the school year. The U.S. Bureau of the Census includes such persons as members of the family at the home address for the Current Population Survey. The Health Interview Survey classifies them as individuals or family members at the students' address at school. Thus subdivision of families from this cause would result in more families and unrelated individuals in the Health Interview Survey data.

Another source of difference between these counts are the different dates of enumeration. The Current Population Survey count was made in March 1976 immediately following the week containing the twelfth of the month, and the Health Interview Survey data are from the average of 13 weeks of interviewing in January-March 1976. Since both surveys are samples of the population they are subject to sampling variability which may account for some portion of the differences.

## FAMILY OUT-OF-POCKET HEALTH EXPENSES

### All Families and Unrelated Individuals

During 1975 the average annual out-of-pocket expense per family was \$798 for the eight items of health expense, namely: hospital, doctor, dental, prescription medicine, optical, health insurance premiums, other medical expenses, and expense for persons outside the family unit (tables A, B, and 1). When expenses

for persons outside the family are excluded, the total is \$773 (table 2), and when health insurance premiums are also excluded, the total is reduced to \$575 (table 3).

The average family spent \$93 out of pocket for hospital bills paid directly by the family (table B). Hospital bills include any hospital outpatient or inpatient services. Doctor bills per family totaled \$201 per family per year, and dental bills averaged \$134 per year. Prescription medicine cost an average of \$98 per family. Optical services spending was \$46 per family. Optical expense includes spending for eyeglasses

or contact lenses as well as the fee of an optometrist. However, the fee of an opthalmologist is included under doctor expense. Health insurance premiums cost an average of \$197 per family. Included in this total are the amounts for private health insurance and Social Security Medicare paid directly by the family, deducted from pay checks, or from Social Security benefits. Excluded from health insurance premiums were amounts for insurance that pays only when an accident occurs. The average family expense for "other" was \$19 per year. Other included spending for chiropractors or podiatrists, special




Figure 1. Annual out-of-pocket health expenses per family unit and unrelated individual, by type of expense and size of family unit

aids such as braces, physical or speech therapy, special nursing care, etc. Specifically excluded was spending for nonprescribed medicines. An average of \$27 per year was spent for persons outside the family.

Similar data for unrelated individuals are presented in tables C and D. With the exception of spending for other persons (included in the first total in table C and the last item in table D), these estimates may be compared with those presented in Personal Out-of-Pocket Health Expenses (Series 10, No. 122). Since most unrelated individuals are 17 years and over, comparisons should be limited to the adult age groups. Per capita health spending, excluding health insurance premiums, for persons 45-64 years was \$265 and, for persons 65 years and older, the figure was \$344. The comparable figures for unrelated individuals were \$290 and \$307, respectively. The substantial agreement in

health expenses for these two age groups is accounted for because 12.1 percent of all persons 45-64 years are unrelated individuals and, correspondingly, 30.1 percent of all persons 65 years and over.




Figure 2. Percent of family units with annual out-of-pocket health expenses of \$1,000 and \$2,000 or more, by type of expense and size of family unit

The three health expense totals per family with five or more members exceed the expense totals for smaller families by a substantial amount—an excess of about \$100 per family (figure 1). Tables A and B show family composition within each size of family group. Husbandwife families spend more than do other family groups. Tables 1-11 present data for the three groups of total expenses and each of the eight individual types of expenses. Also presented in these tables is the proportion of family units with selected intervals of expense. Figure 2 shows that as size of family increases so does the proportion of families with health expenses exceeding \$1,000 and \$2,000 per year for each




Figure 3. Percent of family units reporting <u>no</u> annual out-of-pocket health expenses for the three categories of health care costs, by type of expense and size of family unit

of the three types of total expense. Figure 3 shows the proportions of family units with no annual out-of-pocket health spending for the three totals. In each of tables 1-11 there appears a column showing the average expense for family unit with expense. These figures are prepared by excluding the family units with no expense from the computation of expense per family unit. If a substantial number of units have no expense for an item, the difference between the average expense for the family unit with expense and the per family unit expense will be large. For instance table 4 shows that 70.5 percent of all families had no hospital expense, accounting for the difference in the average expense for family unit with expense of \$315 and \$93 per family unit.

Tables 12-14 present information for the three groups of totals by sex of unrelated individuals or the head of other family groups. Female unrelated individuals spend more than males do. The reverse is noted for other family groups, with male-headed other families having larger expense per family than did female-headed families.

#### Family Income




Figure 4. Annual out-of-pocket health expenses per family unit, by type of expense and annual family income

As family income rises, so do the out-of-pocket health expense totals (table H and figure 4). In general this relationship is present in most of the size of family groups. Expense totals per unrelated individual with \$15,000 or more annual income clearly exceeded those with lesser incomes. Tables 15-17 present detailed information for the three types of total expenses for four income groups.

The expense totals for two-person families with annual income less than \$5,000 clearly exceed those of larger size families in this low income group. This is accounted for by the presence of numerous aged persons comprising two-person families.

Out-of-pocket health spending takes a larger share of family income in the lower income groups than it does for the higher income groups. For instance, if an average or median income is assumed for each of the four income groups of \$2,500, \$7,500, \$12,500, and \$20,000, respectively, the proportionate share of family income spent for health expenses may

be determined. Using the figures in table H for all families for the grand total, the \$591 spent by the lowest income group represents about 23.6 percent of the average income. Similarly, in the next three income groups the proportionate share of income spent out of pocket for health expense declines: 9.3 percent, 6.3 percent, and 4.6 percent of the three assumed averages.

### Color and Family Income




Figure 5. Annual out-of-pocket health expenses per family unit, by type of expense, color, and family income

Out-of-pocket health spending per family unit for the three types of total expense are summarized by color and family income in figure 5 and table J. White unrelated individuals spend more per person on health expense than do other unrelated individuals (tables 18-20). In

general, this pattern is present in the data for families with white families having larger expense totals per family than other families do. There is much less difference in spending for family incomes of \$10,000 or more. For these families the expense totals are quite similar by color or are larger for the families other than white.

# Comparison With 1974 and 1970 Family Unit Expenses

Table K summarizes health expenses for the three totals and eight expense items for unrelated individuals and families for the expense years 1975, 1974, and 1970. Family out-of-pocket health expenses for 1970 were presented in the Series 10, No. 103 report. Since the questionnaires used for the three time periods were substantially the same, the per family unit expenses presented are comparable.

In general these figures reflect the rise in health spending noted in other sources of health expenditure data, notably the Social Security Administration's series of national health expenditure data. However, it should be noted that these figures have *not* been adjusted to take into account the inflationary trend between 1970 and 1975.

#### APPENDIX I

# TECHNICAL NOTES ON METHODS

### **Background of This Report**

This report is one of a series of statistical reports prepared by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS). It is based on information collected in a continuing nationwide sample of households in the Health Interview Survey (HIS).

The Health Interview Survey utilizes a questionnaire which obtains information on personal and demographic characteristics, illness, injuries, impairments, chronic conditions, and other health topics. As data relating to each of these various broad topics are tabulated and analyzed, separate reports are issued that cover one or more of the specific topics.

The population covered by the sample for the Health Interview Survey is the civilian noninstitutionalized population of the United States living at the time of the interview. The sample does not include members of the Armed Forces of U.S. nationals living in foreign countries. It should also be noted that the estimates shown do not represent a complete measure of any given topic during the specified calendar period since data are not collected in the interview for persons who died during the reference period. For many types of statistics collected in the survey, the reference period covers the 2 weeks prior to the interview week. For such a short period, the contribution by decedents to a total inventory of conditions or services should be very small. However, the contribution by decedents during a long reference period (e.g., 1 year) might be sizable, especially for older persons.

# Statistical Design of the Health Interview Survey

General plan. The sampling plan of the survey follows a multistage probability design that permits a continuous sampling of the civilian noninstitutionalized population of the United States. The sample is designed in such a way that the sample of households interviewed each week is representative of the target population and that weekly samples are additive over time. This feature of the design permits both continuous measurement of characteristics of samples and more detailed analysis of less common characteristics and smaller categories of health-related items. The continuous collection has administrative and operational advantages as well as technical assets since it permits fieldwork to be handled with an experienced, stable staff.

The overall sample was designed so that tabulations can be provided for each of the four major geographic regions and for selected places of residence in the United States.

The first stage of the sample design consists of drawing a sample of 376 primary sampling units (PSU's) from approximately 1,900 geographically defined PSU's. A PSU consists of a county, a small group of contiguous counties, or a standard metropolitan statistical area. The PSU's collectively cover the 50 States and the District of Columbia.

With no loss in general understanding, the remaining stages can be combined and treated in this discussion as an ultimate stage. Within PSU's, then, ultimate stage units called segments are defined in such a manner that each segment

contains an expected four households. Three general types of segments are used.

Area segments which are defined geographically.

List segments, using 1970 census registers as the frame.

Permit segments, using updated lists of building permits issued in sample PSU's since 1970.

Census address listings were used for all areas of the country where addresses were well defined and could be used to locate housing units. In general the list frame included the larger urban areas of the United States from which about two-thirds of the HIS sample was selected.

The usual HIS sample consists of approximately 12,000 segments containing about 50,000 assigned households, of which 9,000 were vacant, demolished, or occupied by persons not in the scope of the survey. The 41,000 eligible occupied households yield a probability sample of about 120,000 persons.

Descriptive material on data collection, field procedures, and questionnaire development in the HIS has been published<sup>1,2</sup> as well as a detailed description of the sample design<sup>3</sup> and a report on the estimation procedure and the method used to calculate sampling errors of estimates derived from the survey.<sup>4</sup>

Collection of data.—Field operations for the survey are performed by the U.S. Bureau of the Census under specifications established by the National Center for Health Statistics. In accordance with these specifications the Bureau of the Census participates in survey planning, selects the sample, and conducts the field interviewing as an agent of NCHS. The data are coded, edited, and tabulated by NCHS.

Estimating procedures.—Since the design of the HIS is a complex multistage probability sample, it is necessary to use complex procedures in the derivation of estimates. Four basic operations are involved:

 Inflation by the reciprocal of the probability of selection.—The probability of selection is

- the product of the probabilities of selection from each step of selection in the design (PSU, segment, and household).
- 2. Nonresponse adjustment.—The estimates are inflated by a multiplication factor which has as its numerator the number of sample households in a given segment and as its denominator the number of households interviewed in that segment.
- 3. First-stage ratio adjustment.—Sampling theory indicates that the use of auxilliary information which is highly correlated with the variables being estimated improves the reliability of the estimates. To reduce the variability between PSU's within a region, the estimates are ratio adjusted to the 1970 populations within 12 color-residence classes.
- 4. Poststratification by age-sex-color.—The estimates are ratio adjusted within each of 60 age-sex-color cells to an independent estimate of the population of each cell for the survey period. These independent estimates are prepared by the Bureau of the Census. Both the first-stage and poststratified ratio adjustments take the form of multiplication factors applied to the weight of each elementary unit (person, household, condition, and hospitalization).

The effect of the ratio-estimating process is to make the sample more closely representative of the civilian noninstitutionalized population by age, sex, color, and residence, which thereby reduces sampling variance.

As noted, each week's sample represents the population living during that week and characteristics of the population. Consolidation of samples over a time period, e.g., a calendar quarter, produces estimates of average characteristics of the U.S. population for the calendar quarter. Similarly, population data for a year are averages of the four quarterly figures.

For prevalence statistics, such as number of persons with speech impairments or number of persons classified by time interval since last physician visit, figures are first calculated for each calendar quarter by averaging estimates for all weeks of interviewing in the quarter. Prevalence data for a year are then obtained by averaging the four quarterly figures.

For other types of statistics-namely those measuring the number of occurrences during a specified time period—such as incidence of acute conditions, number of disability days, or number of visits to a doctor or dentist, a similar computational procedure is used, but the statistics are interpreted differently. For these items, the questionnaire asks for the respondent's experience over the 2 calendar weeks prior to the week of interview. In such instances the estimated quarterly total for the statistic is 6.5 times the average 2-week estimate produced by the 13 successive samples taken during the period. The annual total is the sum of the four quarters. Thus the experience of persons interviewed during a year experience which actually occurred for each person in a 2-calendar-week interval prior to week of interview-is treated as though it measured the total of such experience during the year. Such interpretation leads to no significant bias.

## General Qualifications

Nonresponse. Data were adjusted for nonresponse by a procedure that imputes to persons in a household who were not interviewed the characteristics of persons in households in the same segment who were interviewed.

The interview process. The statistics presented in this report are based on replies obtained in interviews with persons in the sample households. Each person 19 years of age and over present at the time of interview was interviewed individually. For children and for adults not present in the home at the time of the interview, the information was obtained from a related household member such as a spouse or the mother of a child.

There are limitations to the accuracy of diagnostic and other information collected in household interviews. For diagnostic information, the household respondent can usually pass on to the interviewer only the information the physician has given to the family. For conditions not medically attended, diagnostic information is often no more than a description of

symptoms. However, other facts, such as the number of disability days caused by the condition, can be obtained more accurately from household members than from any other source since only the persons concerned are in a position to report this information.

Rounding of numbers. The original tabulations on which the data in this report are based show all estimates to the nearest whole unit. All consolidations were made from the original tabulations using the estimates to the nearest unit. In the final published tables, the figures are rounded to the nearest thousand, although these are not necessarily accurate to that detail. Devised statistics such as rates and percent distributions are computed after the estimates on which these are based have been rounded to the nearest thousand.

Population figures. Some of the published tables include population figures for specified categories. Except for certain overall totals by age, sex, and color, which are adjusted to independent estimates, these figures are based on the sample of households in the HIS. These are given primarily to provide denominators for rate computation, and for this purpose are more appropriate for use with the accompanying measures of health characteristics than other population data that may be available. With the exception of the overall totals by age, sex, and color mentioned above, the population figures differ from figures (which are derived from different sources) published in reports of the Bureau of the Census. Official population estimates are presented in Bureau of the Census reports in Series P-20, P-25, and P-60.

# Reliability of Estimates

Since the statistics presented in this report are based on a sample, they will differ somewhat from the figures that would have been obtained if a complete census had been taken using the same schedules, instructions, and interviewing personnel and procedures.

As in any survey, the results are also subject to reporting and processing errors and errors due to nonresponse. To the extent possible, these types of errors were kept to a minimum by

methods built into survey procedures.<sup>5</sup> Although it is very difficult to measure the extent of bias in the Health Interview Survey, a number of studies have been conducted to study this problem. The results have been published in several reports. <sup>6-9</sup>

The standard error is primarily a measure of sampling variability, that is, the variations that might occur by chance because only a sample of the population is surveyed. As calculated for this report, the standard error also reflects part of the variation which arises in the measurement process. However, it does not include systematic baises that might be in the data. The chances are about 68 out of 100 that an estimate from the sample would differ from a complete census by less than the standard error. The chances are about 95 out of 100 that the difference would be less than twice the standard error and about 99 out of 100 that it would be less than 2½ times as large.

Standard error charts. - The relative standard error of an estimate is obtained by dividing the standard error of the estimate by the estimate itself and is expressed as a percentage of the estimate. For this report, asterisks are shown for any cell with more than a 30-percent relative standard error. Included in this appendix are charts from which the relative standard errors can be determined for estimates shown in the report. In order to derive relative errors that would be applicable to a wide variety of health statistics and that could be prepared at a moderate cost, a number of approximations were required. As a result, the charts provide an estimate of the approximate relative standard error rather than the precise error for any specific aggregate or percentage.

Three classes of statistics for the health survey are identified for purposes of estimating variances.

1. Narrow range. - This class consists of (a) statistics which estimate a population attribute, e.g., the number of persons in a particular income group, and (b) statistics for which the measure for a single individual during the reference period used in data

- collection is usually either 0 or 1 on occasion may take on the value 2 or very rarely 3.
- 2. Medium range. This class consists of other statistics for which the measure for a single individual during the reference period used in data collection will rarely lie outside the range 0-5.
- 3. Wide range. This class consists of statistics for which the measure for a single individual during the reference period used in data collection can range from 0 to a number in excess of 5, e.g., the number of days of bed disability.

In addition to classifying variables according to whether they are narrow-, medium-, or wide-range, statistics in the survey are further classified as to whether they are based on a reference period of 2 weeks, 6 months, or 12 months.

General rules for determining relative standard errors.—The following rules will enable the reader to determine approximate relative standard errors from the charts for estimates presented in this report. These charts represent standard errors of HIS data.

- Rule 1. Estimates of aggregates: Approximate relative standard errors for estimates of aggregates such as the number of persons with a given characteristic are obtained from appropriate curves in figure I. The number of persons in the total U.S. population or in an age-sex-color class of the total population is adjusted to official Bureau of the Census figures and is not subject to sampling error.
- Rule 2. Estimates of percentages in a percent distribution: Relative standard errors for percentages in a percent distribution of a total are obtained from appropriate curves in figure II. For values that do not fall on one of the curves presented in the chart, visual interpolation will provide a satisfactory approximation.
- Rule 3. Estimates of rates where the numerator is a subclass of the denominator: This

rule applies for prevalence rates or where a unit of the numerator occurs, with few exceptions, only once in the year for any one unit in the denominator. For example, in computing the rate of visual impairments per 1,000 population, the numerator consisting of persons with the impairment is a subclass of the denominator, which includes all persons in the population. Such rates if converted to rates per 100 may be treated as though they were percentages and the relative standard errors obtained from the percentage charts for population estimates. Rates per 1,000, or on any other base, must first be converted to rates per 100; then the percentage chart will provide the relative standard error per 100.

- Rule 4. Estimates of rates where the numerator is not a subclass of the denominator:


  This rule applies where a unit of the numerator often occurs more than once for any one unit in the denominator. For example, in the computation of the number of persons injured per 100 currently employed persons per year, it is possible that a person in the denominator could have sustained more than one of the injuries included in the numerator. Approximate relative standard errors for rates of this kind may be computed as follows:
  - (a) Where the denominator is the total U.S. population or includes all persons in one or more of the age-sexcolor groups of the total population, the relative error of the rate is equivalent to the relative error of the numerator, which can be obtained directly from the appropriate chart.

- (b) In other cases the relative standard error of the numerator and of the denominator can be obtained from the appropriate curve. Square each of these relative errors, add the resulting values, and extract the square root of the sum. This procedure will result in an upper bound on the standard error and often will overstate the error.
- Rule 5. Estimates of difference between two statistics (mean, rate, total, etc.): The standard error of a difference is approximately the square root of the sum of the squares of each standard error considered separately. A formula for the standard error of a difference,

$$d = X_1 - X_2$$
 is 
$$\sigma_d = \sqrt{(X_1 \mid Y_{x1})^2 + (X_2 \mid Y_{x2})^2}$$


where  $X_1$  is the estimate for class 1,  $X_2$  is the estimate for class 2, and  $V_{x\,1}$  and  $V_{x\,2}$  are the relative errors of  $X_1$  and  $X_2$ , respectively. This formula will represent the actual standard error quite accurately for the difference between separate and uncorrelated characteristics although it is only a rough approximation in most other cases. The relative standard error of each estimate involved in such a difference can be determined by one of the four rules just stated, whichever is appropriate.

#### APPENDIX II

# DEFINITIONS OF CERTAIN TERMS USED IN THIS REPORT

# Terms Relating to Out-of-Pocket Health Expenses

Out-of-pocket expense.—The amount paid directly by the individual or family member exclusive of any part paid by insurance, other person, or agency. The following definitions pertain only to out-of-pocket expenses.

Dental bills.—The amount spent for cleaning, filling, straightening, bridgework, dental laboratory fees, and other services from a dentist or hygienist.

Doctor bills.—The amount spent for rountine doctor visits, treatments, checkups, doctor fees while a patient in a hospital, operations, deliveries, pregnancy care, laboratory fees, shots, and other services by a medical doctor.

Hospital bills.—The amount spent for room and board, operating and delivery rooms, anesthesia, tests, X-rays, special treatments, and any other hospital service.

Payments for prescription medicine.—Amounts spent for only those medicines prescribed by a doctor or dentist.

Payments for optical bills.—Amounts spent for eyeglasses, contact lenses, or optometrist's fees.

Payments for other medical bills.—Amounts spent for chiropractor's or podiatrist's fees, hearing aid, special brace, truss, wheelchair, artificial limb, physical or speech therapy, special nursing care, and nursing home or convalescent home care.

Payments for health insurance premiums.— Amounts spent on premiums for health insurance coverage for any part of a hospital bill or doctor's bill.

# Family and Related Terms

The definitions of families and unrelated individuals (family units) are the same as those used in the 1960 census.

Family refers to a group of two persons or more related by blood, marriage, or adoption who are living together in the same household. Although the usual household contains only the primary family, a household can contain secondary families as well as individuals unrelated to the family. A lodger and his family who are not related to the head of the household or a resident employee and his wife living in are considered a secondary family and not part of the primary family. However, if the son of the head of the household and the son's wife and children are members of the household, this subfamily is treated as part of the primary family.

Individuals are persons (other than inmates of institutions) who are not living with any relatives. An unrelated individual can be (1) a household head living alone or with nonrelatives, (2) a lodger or resident employee with no relatives in the household, (3) a staff member of an institution who has no relatives living with him, or (4) a resident of a dormitory, lodging house, or other shared-residence facility who has no relative living with him.

Head of family is usually the person regarded as the "head" by the members of the group. Married women are never classified as heads if their husbands are living with them at the time of the survey. Only one person in

each family can be designated as the head. Therefore the number of heads of families is equal to the number of families.

Other family members are all persons who are related to the head of the family by blood, marriage, or adoption. The category "child under 17," used as a classifier of husband-wife families, refers to a child of these parents and includes an adopted child, a foster child, or a ward but excludes a grandchild.

# **Demographic Terms**

Age. The age recorded for each person is the age at last birthday. Age is recorded in single years and grouped in a variety of distributions depending on the purpose of the table.

Color. The population is divided into two color groups, "white" and "all other." "All

other" includes Negro, American Indian, Chinese, Japanese, and any other race. Mexican persons are included with "white" unless definitely known to be Indian or of another race.

Income of family or of unrelated individuals. Each member of a family is classified according to the total income of the family of which he is a member. Within the household all persons related to each other by blood, marriage, or adoption constitute a family. Unrelated individuals are classified according to their own income.

The income recorded is the total of all income received by members of the family (or by an unrelated individual) in the 12-month period preceding the week of interview. Income from all sources is included, e.g., wages, salaries, rents from property, pensions, and help from relatives.
