Quarterly National HAI Incidence Brief Report

This [new report](#) summarizes national HAI data from 2022 at the quarterly-level and comments on the comparison of these SIRs to those from a pre-pandemic (2019) time. The paper highlights the shift in the MRSA bacteremia SIRs that occurred throughout 2022.
