Re: Particulate Respirators and Fit-testing Rule Published in Federal Register 5/24/94

I am nurse epidemiologist, in infection control practice for 18 years, employed by the University of California Davis, Medical Center. I am encouraging NIOSH to certify the Class C particulate respirator for use in health care facilities for use by employees to prevent exposure to TB patients.

The reclassification of respirators will allow for adequate protection of employees without muffling or decreasing volume for verbal communication with the patient. The HEPA filter respirator interferes with verbal communication with the patient and therefore interferes with patient care practice.

I recommend that fit-testing with Class C respirators be eliminated.
