This letter is to let it be known that the Administrative Staff of Johnson-Willis Hospital <u>supports</u> the proposed rule addressing NIOSH's and the Department of Labor/Mine Safety and Health Administration's certification requirements for respiratory protective devices (42 CFR Part 84).

The Administrative Staff of Johnston-Willis Hospital supports the proposal for the following reasons:

- The Hospital will have a broader range of certified respirators that meet the current performance criteria recommended by the CDC for respiratory devices for protection against Mycobacterium tuberculosis.
- 2. The provisions of this proposed rule will address requirements for certifying air-purifying respirators against <u>biological</u> agents, namely Mycobacterium tuberculosis.
- 3. Due to the six classes of air-purifying particulate respirators to be certified meeting the recommendation by the CDC being less expensive than the respirator with a HEPA filter, the Hospital would be able to continue in its attempts to curtail costs while at the same time providing ample protection against Mycobacterium tuberculosis.
