Dear Ms. Manning,

Enclosed is some material from our organization in response to the Federal Register Notice that requests information on the Workers' Family Protection Act (29 USC 671a). My apologies for not getting this material to you by the February 14th deadline but your director, Dr. Niemeier told me that you were still accepting responses.

The material includes information from one of our sister organizations' Pesticide Education Center (PEC). PEC is directed by Dr. Marion Moses, a physician specializing in occupational and environmental medicine with many years experience investigating and diagnosing pesticide-related illnesses in farm workers and their families.
