For the following reasons, I encourage NIOSH to eliminate the prohibition on buddy breathing and allow the use of buddy breathing/EBSS.

- · The majority of SCBA's sold in the U.S. include this unregulated device.
- Â. The present technology eliminates the possibility of IDLH exposure.
- \hat{A} . There have been no reported failures or fatalities caused by the use of an EBSS.
- A. There have been documented successes of EBSS being used to remove firefighters from an IDLH environment.
- · The NFPA survey that received 1,962 responses indicates that firefighters overwhelmingly want an EBSS available as an option.
- A· Federal OSHA and OSHA in most states indicate that the use of buddy breathing is encouraged even at the expense of voiding NIOSH certification.
- $\hat{\mathsf{A}} \cdot \mathsf{NFPA}$ has drafted language to include in 1981 Standard for testing of an EBSS.
- A. Members of NFPA 1404 and 1500 have indicated that they agree with the proposed inclusion of EBSS in 1981 and the elimination of the NIOSH prohibition.
- $\hat{A} \cdot IAFF$ has lent its support for firefighter safety to include EBSS as an available option on SCBAâ \in TMS.
