PA AND LATERAL CHEST RADIOGRAPHS: deted 11-Jan-2002 were evaluated for the presence of pneumocomiosis, ntilizing the ILO (1980) guidelines.

The heart, mediastimum, and pulmonary vasculature are unremarkable. There are irregular interstitial opecities present within the lower hugs, the size/shape of which is classified as t/t, and the profusion is 1/0. Likewise, there are pleural plaques present, some of which are calcified.

opinion: Bilateral interstitial fibrosis and pleural plaque formation considered virtually pathognomonic for asbestosis given the appropriate exposure history and latency period.
