- \$2.5 million authorized and appropriated by Congress




NIOSH Fire Fighter Fatality Investigation and Prevention Program

- Trauma Fatalities Division of Safety Research, Morgantown, WV
- Cardiovascular Fatalities Division of Surveillance, Field Studies and Hazard Evaluations, Cincinnati, OH



NIOSH Program

- Data Base Develop national data base on fatalities
- Intervention Research Projects Evaluate effectiveness of specific equipment, practices, and programs
- Applied Laboratory and Field Research Project - Initiate and fund field and laboratory studies.
