(Cf. Miller v. National Cabinet Co., 8 N.Y.2d 277, 284 N.Y.S. 2d 122, 108 N.E.2d 811.)</p> <p>The board found:</p> <p>Upon review of the record the Board Panel finds, based on the testimony of Mr. Kita, that tests performed on samples of talc used in the license of Dr. Nelson indicate that defendant's underlying lung condition, carcinoma, is a predisposing factor for lung cancer and Dr. Mason's testimony that there is a definite relationship between asbestos and lung cancer, that the decedent's death on 5/26/78 is causally related to his compensable occupational carcinoma.</p> <p>The record as a whole contains substantial evidence supporting the award of death benefits.</p> <p>Decision affirmed.</p> <p><b>Workers' Compensation Case 1599</b> In workers' compensation proceeding wherein death benefits were awarded, evidence sufficiently supports Workers' Compensation Board's finding to effect that decedent's death due to lung cancer was causally related to his compensable pneumonia.</p>
