The following comments are from the Western Broome Environmental Stakeholders Coalition regarding niosh/review/public/103 (Docket number NIOSH-103)

- 1. The exposure should be associated with a department or workers performing similar tasks.
- 2. The study should compare the IBM workers to healthy workers and not the general population.
  - 3. If IBM does not provide workers' records, NIOSH should subpoena the records.
  - 4. The study should use the existing study of Endicott residents diseases for reference.
  - 5. The main concern of the study should be TCE; the other chemicals should also be studied.
- 6. The main concern is cancer, non-cancer diseases should also be studied. Included should be birth defects of children of workers.
- NIOSH should summarize the comments and respond to the comments in forum such as a WBESC meeting.
  - 8. The study should address such questions as the following:

What was the worker exposure? Skin, inhalation?

- 8. Prepare a task list and a timeline for the study. NIOSH should prepare a progress report to WBESC on a quarterly basis when the study begins
  - 9. The records that will be used are as follows:
    - a. National death records
    - b. State cancer registry

- c. Working history and chemicals used.
- d. ECHOES database and Corporate Mortality File
- 10. The WBESC supports this study and will seek political support for the funding.
