## Comments

NIOSH needs to stop testing and listing SCBA air packs as a complete unit. When the cylinder is already regulated the DOT it is redundent and limits choices of the end user. These cylinders are not altered or tested in a significant way by the SCBA manufacturer. The status of having the complete unit being purchased only through the manufacturer only raised the price for the end user and limits the availability to firefighters.

This limited availability causes reduced safety due to a reluctance to change cylinders or purchase new or different SCBA packs.
