Enactment of EEOICPA

- Enacted October 2000
 - Part B, mandatory federal entitlement, by DOL
 - Part D, state workers comp. assistance, by DOE
- Amendments October 2004
 - Abolished Part D, created federal Part E, transferred to DOL
- 160,322 cases filed, over \$9 billion total compensation paid to date
- Agencies: Labor, Energy, HHS, Justice
- DOL locations
 - DC, Jacksonville, Cleveland, Denver, and Seattle


NIOSH Referral Case Status

 39,206 Cases Referred to NIOSH for Dose Reconstruction

- 36,817 Cases Returned by NIOSH
 - 31,244 with Dose Reconstruction
 - 5,573 without Dose Reconstruction
- 2,389 Cases Currently at NIOSH
 - 1,543 Initial Referrals to NIOSH
 - 846 Reworks or Returns to NIOSH

NIOSH Dose Reconstruction Case Status

- 31,244 Cases returned by NIOSH w/ a Dose Reconstruction (DR)
- 25,461 Cases w/ DR and a Final Decision
 - 9,099 Final Approvals (POC 50% or Greater)
 - 16,362 Final Denials (POC less than 50%)




Part B Cancer Cases with Final Decision to Accept

- Accepted DR Cases 8,496
 - 11,995 Payees
 - \$ 1.26 Billion paid compensation
- Accepted SEC Cases 18,347
 - 30,225 Payees
 - \$2.71 Billion paid compensation
- Cases Accepted Based on SEC Status and POC > 50% 603
 - 733 Payees
 - \$90.2 Million paid compensation
- Totals: All Accepted SEC and DR Cases 27,446
 - 42,953 Payees
 - \$4.06 Billion paid compensation


Top Four Worksites
