NIOSH Referral Case Status


- 54,138 Cases Referred to NIOSH for Dose Reconstruction

 - 46,182 with Dose Reconstruction
 - 6,564 withdrawn from NIOSH with no Dose Reconstruction
- 1,392 Cases Currently at NIOSH
 - 880 Initial/Original Referrals to NIOSH
 - 512 Reworks or Returns to NIOSH

Part B Cases with Dose Reconstruction and Final Decision




