

World Trade Center 9.11 Health Program Responder Benefits



Once enrolled as a 9/11 Responder, you may be eligible for no-cost medical monitoring and treatment for your certified WTC-related health condition through the World Trade Center (WTC) Health Program.

Monitoring Exams

Responders can receive an initial health evaluation and then an annual monitoring exam each year with or without a certified WTC-related health condition.

Mental Health Benefits

The Program covers mental health services for WTC-related health conditions, such as:

- Therapy and counseling
- Substance use disorder treatment

Pharmacy Benefits

The Program covers prescription drugs used to treat a WTC-related health condition:

- Up to 90-day supply at Walgreens or Duane Reade Pharmacies
- Up to 30-day supply at all other participating retail pharmacies
- 90-days supply of maintenance medication through Express Scripts Home Delivery
- Up to 30-day supply through Accredo Specialty Pharmacy

Benefits Counseling

The Program offers various types of benefits counseling, including:

- Workers' Compensation counseling
- September 11th Victim Compensation Fund assistance
- External work-related and disability benefits counseling
- Social services assistance
- Cancer care assistance
- Non-covered conditions assistance
